

VA RETAIL IMMUNIZATION CARE COORDINATION PROGRAM

MORE OPTIONS, EASIER ACCESS, SEAMLESS RECORDS

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is partnering with Walgreens to offer greater choices of time and location for enrolled Veteran patients to get their seasonal flu shot.

JUST THE FACTS:

- Enrolled Veterans can get their seasonal flu shot at any VA health care facility or Walgreens¹ that administers them.
- To get a seasonal flu shot at Walgreens, enrolled Veterans need only tell the pharmacist that they receive care at a VA medical facility, and show their VA ID card.
- After Walgreens administers the vaccine, the immunization record is transmitted to the patient's VA health record — securely, and within the established requirements of the eHealth Exchange.²
- Important information, including the type of immunization, the date and the administering provider, will be part of the Veteran's VA electronic health record (EHR).
- Walgreens accepts most insurance plans, including Medicare. However, there may be a cost to a VA patient for the flu shot.
